# Open Sprint Round 2 21 July 2024

## 1 AUTHORITY:

The Event will be held under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices and the National Competition Rules of Motorsport Australia, the Autocross Standing Regulations, these Supplementary Regulations and any Further Regulations, Bulletins or instructions issued by the Organisers.

This Event will be conducted under and in accordance with Motorsport Australia OH&S, Motorsport Australia Safety 1<sup>st</sup>, Legal and Integrity Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the Motorsport Australia website at www.motorsport.org.au

#### 2 EVENT DESCRIPTIONS:

The Event will be a **Club status Open Sprint** (**Autocross**), comprising of timed laps conducted on a flat, smooth, unsealed track approximately one kilometre in length. Each competitor's timed run will consist of one (1) standing lap and three (3) flying laps, totalling four (4) laps. The course does not contain jumps or mud holes. The Event will be held at Willowbank Motorsport Park (Lot 102 Champions Way Willowbank) on the 21 July 2024.

# 6 **JUDGES OF FACT:**

- (a) Scrutineers shall be deemed Judges of Fact in respect to:
  - Safety equipment
  - Eligibility of vehicles
  - Measurement of emitted noise
- (b) The Start Official (his/her assistants where applicable) shall be deemed Judges of Fact in respect to: -
  - Starting Grid procedures and false starts.
  - Finish line procedures and order of finish and penalties applied.
- (c) The Clerk of the Course and Official Observers shall be deemed Judges of Fact in respect to: Penalties applied for leaving the track, hitting track markers and crossing boundaries. Speeding in the Pit Area, disobeying the flags and any other rules. Competitors are reminded that there is no right to protest the decision of a Judge of Fact.

### 7 START:

The Event will commence at approx. 8:45am, subject to Track Condition and Electronic Timing confirmation, and will finish at approx. 4.00pm at the completion of up to 6 runs. An extra run may be permitted depending on time.

### 8 ENTRIES

Entries open with the issue of these Regulations and close on Friday 19 July 2024 at 6pm.

Entries must be completed online with a Disclaimer and Self Scrutiny form signed on the day. Entries may be accepted on the day at the discretion of the Event Secretary.

The event may be limited to 45 starters.

Any entry that is not accepted will be refunded in full.

Entries may be refused in accordance with the NCR.

### 9 PARENTAL CONSENT:

If any entrant, Driver or pit crew is under 18 years of age, the consent of his/her parent or guardian must appear on the Entry Form.

## 10 PERSONS ELIGIBLE:

The Event shall be open only to persons over 14 years of age who are members of IWMAC, a Motorsport Australia affiliated club and hold a valid Motorsport Australia Speed Licence or a Motorsport Australia licence of higher status. (Speed/Speed Junior)

## 11 **SCRUTINY:**

Scrutiny will be held at the Scrutiny Pad, Willowbank Park, from 7.00am. to 8.15am, or at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.

Randomly selected vehicles must be scrutineered prior to participating; only authorised vehicles may practice and compete.

ALL VEHICLES MUST COMPLY WITH TECHNICAL APPENDIX SCHEDULE A & B OF THE MOTORSPORT AUSTRALIA MANUAL TO COMPETE AT THIS EVENT.

Documents: The following documents must be presented at scrutiny.

Current Motorsport Australia Competition Speed Licence or greater

Current Ipswich West Moreton Auto Club **Membership Card** or another current Motorsport Australia affiliated Club Membership

Motorsport Australia Vehicle Logbook (where issued)

Vehicles having current registration in Queensland under the "Transport Operations (Road Use Management— Vehicle Registration) Regulation 1999" require a -

Compulsory Third-Party Insurance (CTPI) extension valid for this Event.

Apparel, including helmets, footwear, and clothing must be produced at Scrutiny and on request during the Event.

### 12 **DRIVERS' BRIEFING:**

A compulsory Drivers' Briefing will be held out the front of the club rooms at approx. 8.15am.

#### 13 STARTING ORDER

Running order starts from the vehicle having the lowest competition number and finishing with the vehicle having the highest competition number or may be run under class order but may be varied at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course. The running order will show the second Entry of a dual Entry running at the end of each run.

## 14 FAMILIARISATION RUNS

Familiarisation runs will commence at the completion of drivers briefing but prior to the start of the Event. A minimum of 2 familiarisation runs will be permitted per competitor.

## 15 INSURANCE

Motorsport Australia. Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by Motorsport Australia in relation to the Event. Further details can be found in the Motorsport Australia Insurance Handbook, available at <a href="https://www.motorsport.org.au">www.motorsport.org.au</a>

#### 16 TIMING:

Timing will be by electronic or digital timing. Timing commences for each Competitor when the Dorian attached to the vehicle crosses the start line and finishes when the Dorian on the vehicle crosses the finish line. Competitors may start in their own time after direction from the starter. In this event the placings will be determined by the fastest LAP of the day.

## 17 PENALTIES

In addition to penalties applied under Motorsport Australia Manual and the Autocross Standing Regulations the additional penalties will apply: -

(a) Hitting a hat Recorded
(b) Crossing the track boundary Recorded

(c) Three or more recorded (a) and (b) in one run

All lap times for that run deleted
(d) Deliberate and/or blatant shortening of the course
(e) Failing to complete a run

All lap times for that run deleted
Completed lap times counted

(f) Exceeding 10 km/h in the pit area Clerk of the Course

### 18 PROTESTS:

Any protests must be lodged in accordance with the provisions of the current NCR.

## 19 ABANDONMENT:

The Organiser reserves the right to abandon, postpone or stop the Event in accordance with the NCR and may cancel the Event if fewer than 26 entries are received.

### 20 VEHICLE CATEGORIES - CLASSES:

Class A Production vehicles up to 1600cc
Class B Production vehicles 1601cc to 2000cc
Class C Production vehicles 2001cc to 3000cc
Class D Production vehicles over 3000cc

Class E Four-wheel drive vehicles & specials of all capacities

Junior class Defined between ages 14 & 18, cars up to 2 litres. No 4wd, Turbo or Supercharged.

Junior A Where a Junior drives a car greater than 2 litres. No 4wd, Turbo or Supercharged.

Ladies Open Class: This will be for all Class "E" type cars (AWD)
Ladies 2WD Class: This will be for all Class A-D type cars (combined)

Entries will be accepted at the discretion of the organisers and subject to the provisions of the Track Licence. Small number of entries in any class may lead to amalgamation at the discretion of the organisers.

## 21 INTEGRITY

Smoking (which includes e-cigarettes and "vaping") and any naked flame is prohibited within 3 metres of any refuelling/defueling operation.

Motorsport Australia's National Integrity Framework and any associated policy (including the Australian Anti-Doping Policy. Motorsport Australia's Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy, the Motorsport Australia Alcohol Policy), apply to any activity authorised by Motorsport Australia as published at <a href="https://www.motorsport.org.au">www.motorsport.org.au</a>.

Any Participant including the holder of a Motorsport Australia Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of alcohol, any drug or other banned substance. In addition to any penalty imposed by Motorsport Australia, a further penalty/s may be applied by Sport Integrity Australia. Consumption of alcohol in any Reserved Area is prohibited until all Competition is concluded each day.

### 22 AWARDS:

1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> in each class. If only 2 in class 1<sup>st</sup> only will receive award, other awards may be awarded at the discretion of the organising committee.

# 23 <u>DETERMINATION OF WINNERS:</u> (Open Sprint)

The results will be determined by the fastest LAP for the Event to the slowest in each class. In this event the placings will be determined by the fastest LAP of the day.

#### 24 APPAREL:

Drivers must wear apparel complying with Schedule D of the Motorsport Australia Manual during practice and the Event.

- A helmet that complies with the Motorsport Australia Manual and carries marking to that effect.
- Non-flammable clothing, including cover from ankles to wrist to throat. No person will be permitted to compete wearing apparel of nylon or similar material.
- Enclosed suitable footwear. Leather Preferred. No Nylon or flammable materials.
- Goggles or visors with lens other than glass (to AS1609) in open cars.

### 25 SAFETY - CARS:

The attention of competitors is drawn to Technical Appendix Schedule A and B of the General Requirements of Automobiles found in the Motorsport Australia Manual. The following should be specially noted: -

All cars must be fitted with:

- Seat Belts of a type specifically in Schedule I of the Motorsport Australia Manual and a minimum of lap sash for road registered vehicles.
- A fire extinguisher (securely fitted), which complies with AS1841 (except AS 1841.2) (See Schedule H of the Motorsport Australia Manual). Fire extinguishers shall be maintained in accordance with Australian Standards 1851 Part 1.
- All vehicles must be fitted with Department of Transport Australia (DoT) approved tyres, however not included in allowable tyres are any form of rally tyre.

approved or not) winter tread, grooved, re-treaded, speedway, spiked or knobby treads of any sort.

• The Chief Scrutineer is the Judge of Fact as previously stated at Article 6.

Should further clarification on tyres be required prior to the Event.

It is recommended that contact be made with the Chief Scrutineer before the close of entries.

- Advertising is allowed on vehicles, subject to the NCR.
- Cars must have on their coachwork a **blue triangle** of 150mm sides which indicates the location of the **battery or master switch**.
- All headlights must be adequately masked which complies with Schedule B of the current Motorsport Australia Manual.

## 26. REFUELLING

Refuelling is to be done on the concrete pad where your cars are scrutineered before your race. A second person  $\underline{must}$  be on standby with the extinguisher ready.

### 27 GENERAL

- a) Tubeless tyres must be fitted only to the optimum rim size.
- b) Fuel must be 'Commercial Fuel' as defined by Motorsport Australia (Schedule G of the Motorsport Australia Manual). Competitors must supply their own fuel.
- c) Roll bars are not required, but it is strongly recommended that they be used in open topped cars.
- d) Road registered cars do not require oil catch tanks, tail shaft straps, wired drain plugs, and scatter shields.
- e) Competitor's permanent racing numbers will be used where possible. Competitors must use the number shown on the official list of entries; numbers must be shown on each side of car.
- f) The organisers reserve the right to reject any vehicle that is not presented in a clean and tidy condition.
- g) A speed limit of 10 kph must be maintained in the pits and paddock area.
- h) Drivers must obey all flag signals and instructions by officials while on the course.
- i) Cars must not record sound levels in excess of 95 dB measured 30m from the track edge at any time.

## 28 COMPLIANCE WITH INSTRUCTION:

Failure to follow the direction of any Official / Marshall may render a competitor liable to exclusion from The Event.

## 29 LOCATION DETAILS

From Ipswich to Willowbank, travel along the Cunningham Highway towards Warwick past Amberley. Travel 4.8 km's after the Amberley-Rosewood intersection than turn right into Champions Way. Travel 1 km then turn left into 'Willowbank Park' at the Ipswich West Moreton Auto Club sign.

## 30 CATERING

Canteen facilities will be available on the day.

### 31 PASSENGERS

This Event will <u>NOT</u> include a Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity (MSPRA)

## 32 NOVICE/JUNIORS

With the approval of the Clerk of the Course, Novice/Juniors are permitted to have an instructor in the passenger seat during their run. Only Novice/Juniors will be on the track for their run.

## 33 PARADES AND DEMOSTRATONS

This Event may include a Parade in accordance with the NCR.
